



Japanese knotweed: a guide for homeowners

If you discover Japanese knotweed – don't panic. There's a lot that can be done to stop it becoming an issue



Remember, it is not *illegal* to have it on your land. However you have a duty of care to prevent it spreading



If JK is on an adjacent property, talk to your neighbour and agree a treatment plan



If JK is within the boundary of a property you want to buy it could be a mortgage issue.



How we can help: the JPA strategy



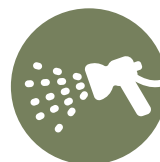
- 1 Identification and confirmation – it's not always knotweed
- 2 Preparation and implementation of a management plan – to include herbicide application programme
- 3 Final confirmation – detailing what we have done and any further steps required

Herbicide application options:

1 Spraying

2 Stem injecting

Should ideally be done when the plant is at its optimum growth



2cm

Can grow up to 2cm in one day



Knotweed can regrow from just a tiny fragment of rhizome left in the soil
